## **“WOW! SCIENCE IS FUN!”**

Make mini-explosions, get covered in cornflour, build bridges, extract the DNA from kiwi fruit and meet a skeleton called Boris- all at a venue near you during July. This summer over 50 Cambridge University students will visit locations in the East, South and South-West, bringing a fun science Roadshow to excite and engage children and parents alike.

**Venues in the East Anglia region include Huntingdon, Newmarket, Letchworth and Milton Keynes.**

Young people often view science as something done by odd people with crazy hair wearing white coats; the keen volunteers on the CHaOS Roadshow want to show the public that this isn't true, and that science is something that they can understand and have a go at for themselves!

CHaOS uses exciting hands-on experiments to provide their own unique brand of science that has something cool to show all of the family. They believe an interactive approach to science can make a real difference to how children learn, as one of the Roadshow organisers explained:

*“We think that Science is about much more than white coats and labs; it's about thinking for yourself and trying out new ideas. We want to show people that science is fun and relevant for all of us. The CHaOS Science Roadshow provides a unique opportunity to get your hands on exciting science with lively and friendly students to explain what's going on.”*

CHaOS has over a decade of experience in organising public science events and visiting schools. CHaOS run a number of events every year around Cambridgeshire.

Each summer we take a van-load of our experiments to areas around the country less well-served with science events.

The 2009 roadshow visited Cambridgeshire, Kent, Cheshire, Lancashire, Cumbria and Lincolnshire and was a huge success, reaching over 4000 visitors in 4 weeks.
